The Start of Something Special...

Nowhere in Scotland is there a School dedicated to the needs of the leading tennis players, and The Tennis Academy has been founded to meet this need.

Merchiston and St George's are known for their sporting and academic excellence, as well as their first rate pastoral care.

In association with Tennis Scotland, we have developed a programme which will ensure that boys can combine an excellent education with unrivalled opportunities within the tennis profession, including expert coaching and aspects of fitness and sports science. With a minimum of three sessions per week, the expectations placed on members of the Tennis Academy by the schools and the coaches will be very high.

The Programme

We have developed a full tennis programme for the Academy Players. As a new programme we are looking to emulate the established academy programmes and to match the opportunities through long-term commitment to training and competition. The programme will be based around a player's formal education where Merchiston and St George's offer a range of academic subjects to meet individual needs and preferences.

Players can join the academy as either *Tour Players* (those who have the potential to compete nationally), or *Challenger Players* (those who have the potential to compete at county level), and separate fact sheets detail the programme for these two categories.

Facilities

Merchiston are investing a significant amount in the resurfacing of three tennis courts, floodlighting and a practice area. Our existing video analysis equipment and sports and fitness expertise will be valuable resources. Our location, five minutes drive from Craiglockhart Tennis Centre, is ideal and we have reserved indoor court time there. Additionally, part of the programme will take place at the Scottish National Tennis Centre in Stirling.

Coach

Tennis Scotland are working with the schools to appoint a first rate full-time coach who will work with Tour and Challenger Players, supporting the existing coaching programme for Tour players on the Tennis Scotland Performance Plan. This post will be advertised shortly.

Funding

The Tennis Academy players will be expected to pay school fees, plus a small Tennis Academy premium. However, a number of bursaries are available for Tour Players at the discretion of the schools. These will be tested in terms of ability, and means-tested based on the financial situation of the family.

Management

The Tennis Academy will be managed by Richard Charman, the Head of Physical Education at Merchiston. A qualified PTR & LTA coach, he will look after the best interests of all members of The Tennis Academy.

Tour Players

'players who have the potential to compete at a national, or international level'

These players will have the opportunity to join The Tennis Academy as an integral part of the *Tennis Scotland Performance Plan*, the aim being to develop successful international tennis players.

The Tennis Academy will provide Tour Players with specialised tennis training and a high level education with a specially adapted, reduced academic curriculum.

They will have the opportunity to board which will allow them to make the most of the opportunities in the programme, and to prepare for life on the tour.

At the same time as participating in the tennis programme, Tour Players will have the opportunity to be involved in school life at Merchiston and St George's and it is seen as a major advantage that they will have more time with their peer group and will be able to maintain good friends, outside of their tennis contacts.

The Academic Curriculum

Both Merchiston and St George's will make arrangements with individual players, to ensure they have a timetable which is suitable for their age and academic talents, and fits with their tennis programme. The reduction will involve them being removed from certain subjects for individual tennis lessons, and being provided with appropriate 'catch-up' time which will be supervised by an appropriate member of staff to make up for any lessons missed due to competitions etc. Each Tour Player will have an individual tutor who will monitor their academic progress closely.

An example timetable for a Tour Player in S1, aged 12, would include a core curriculum of Maths, English, History or Geography, Chemistry, Biology or Physics and French. They would then opt for a number of subjects from Design, Electronics, IT, Art, Music, PSE & Religious Studies.

An example timetable for a Tour Player in S3, would see them embark on a course of 5 or 6 GCSE subjects.

Both Tuesday and Thursday afternoons will be completely free, in order to allow travel to the National Tennis Centre in Stirling for an intensive programme from 1pm – 6pm.

The Tennis Programme

Tennis Scotland has developed a full tennis programme for the Academy *Tour Players*. As a new programme they are looking to emulate the established academy programmes and to match the opportunities through long-term commitment to training and competition. Flexible timetables ensure a comprehensive tennis schedule including individual technical work, squad technical work, strength and conditioning, injury prevention, performance analysis, psychology, and nutrition. A sample weekly schedule is included on a separate sheet.

Each player will have an annual competition schedule and attendance at tournaments with coach support and sports medicine backup.

Tour players will be supported by the East of Scotland, and Scottish Institute of Sport, as well as being mentored by the Scottish National Coach.

There will also be opportunities to access overseas academy programmes for specialist training.
